

Santa Fe, N. Mexico
February 11. 1867.

At a meeting of the Commissioners - under the law passed by the Governor and Legislative Assembly of the Territory of New Mexico - for the purpose of expending suitably the appropriation of fifteen hundred dollars for the erection of a suitable monument to the dead heroes of the late war, who were killed in battle in this Territory -

On motion of Judge Slough the Hon, W. J. M. Army was selected as President, and, the Hon, Simon Delgado as Secretary, then,

The following proceedings were had and resolutions adopted

1st Resolved that the Hon W. J. M. Army be authorized to contract for and order the Tablets for the joint monument to be erected in the Public Plaza of the City of Santa Fe, in honor of the dead soldiers of the battle-fields of the Rebellion, in this Territory - The said Tablets to be four in number - one to be inscribed as follows viz: "The People of the Territory of New Mexico, through their Governor and Legislative Assembly have caused this Monument

to be erected to the memory of the Gallant Dead
of the war of the ~~Great~~ Rebellion, who fell in
this Territory, as a token of their Deep Grati-
-tude to their Defenders and Preservers" - Another
as follows, to be placed opposite the first - viz;
"Erected A.D. 1867" - "By act of Governor and Leg-
-islature Assembly, approved January 31st 1867" -
"Commissioners W. J. Mc Army, Secretary, New Mexico,
John P. Slough, Chief Justice, and Simon Delgado,
Treasurer," - Another as follows, viz: "The Battle
of Velardi was fought on the 21st day of February
A.D. 1862 - The Federal Troops were Commanded
by Col. E. R. S. Canby U.S.A. The Confederate Troops
by Genl. H. N. Sibley C.S.A." - "Sacred to the Mem-
-ory of the Dead Heroes" (To be followed - if possi-
-ble - with a correct list of the dead of that battle)
The fourth as follows viz: "The Battle of Apache
Cañon was fought on the 26. day of March A.D.
1862, and, the Battle of Pigeons Ranch (La Glo-
-rietta) on the 28. day of the same month - The
Federal Troops were Commanded by Col. John P.
Slough U.S.A. The Confederate Troops by Col
Sawney C.S.A." - "Sacred to the memory of the Dead
Heroes" (To be followed - if possible - with a
correct list of the dead of those battles)

2^d Resolved, that an order on the Treasurer
be drawn for the sum of Fifteen hundred
dollars - for the purpose of a monument as

aforsaid - that the sum so drawn be retained
by the Treasurer and passed to the Credit of the
Commission - and, that the signatures of the
President and Secretary of the Commission to
the order as aforsaid shall be authority to the
Auditor to audit the same, and, the Treasurer
to pass the sum to the Credit of the Commis-
-sion -

On motion the Commission then adjourned
